On a personal note, I am still working my way through the dissertation. Some of you may or may not be aware that the topic I have chosen for my thesis is "THE USE OF PSALM 110 IN THE EPISTLE TO THE HEBREWS." This study has been very enriching. Noted below are few introductory matters for your interest:

- Epistle to the Hebrews is said to be a *magnificent* New Testament document that is both carefully constructed and beautifully written and theologically profound and powerfully argued.
- It contains the only *full* discussion in the New Testament of Christ as the believer's high priest. John Calvin regarded this book "unlike any other in Holy Scripture that spoke so *clearly* of the priesthood of Christ."
- Melchizedek is mentioned in only two exceedingly brief passages in the Old Testament, but is made a *key point* in Hebrews, forming the basis for a discussion extending over three chapters.
- ♦ Hebrews reaches back to *use* the Old Testament in an extensive manner after Romans and Matthew.
- Finally, of all the New Testament books, the Book of Psalms is the *most quoted* in the Epistle to the Hebrews.

Next, rightly so, Christians over millennia have believed that Scripture is inspired equally in all parts. Yet, it's a sad fact that some Christians believe that the Old Testament is no longer relevant for today's believers. Did you know that the NT contains an extraordinarily large number of OT quotations? It has been calculated that one verse in 22.5 of the NT is an OT quotation. Therefore, approximately 263 Old Testament quotes in the New Testament could be cited. For your record, New Testament writers cited Psalms and Isaiah the most.

Strikingly it is to be noted that the whole New Testament contains not even one explicit citation of any of the Old Testament Apocrypha, which are considered as canonical by the Roman Catholic Church. This omission can scarcely be viewed as accidental. I hope the next time you come across an OT quote in the NT, you would give your earnest attention to its use. Today, a good reference resource is available. You might want to consider, "Commentary on the New Testament Use of the Old Testament. Ed. by G. K. Beale & D. A. Carson."

Interestingly, the writer to the Hebrews refers to Psalm 110:1 and 4 again and again. Some find in this balance between Ps 110:1 and Ps 110:4 (six references to each) a perfect match between the royal and priestly aspects of Christ's offices and functions. Reventlow notes, "those who received the letter [i.e., Epistle to the Hebrews] would have given indisputable authority to the Old Testament." May we also! Next time I will make some comments on **Psalm 110**.
